Scope

This policy and procedure applies to all assets of West Bedlington Town Council

Policy

West Bedlington Town Council takes its responsibility to protect and preserve our community owned assets and public spaces, including playgrounds very seriously. It is our duty to local taxpayers to create and maintain our unique recreational areas and community bought assets.

West Bedlington Town Council will continue to work closely with the local police and other departments to investigate each and every act of vandalism that occurs within the West Bedlington area.

The Council will seek compensation and / or the utmost penalty under the law against anyone who wilfully, purposefully or maliciously destroys, vandalises or otherwise defaces Town property.

This policy applies to acts by individuals or pets under their care where failure to follow common courtesy, endangers, hampers or otherwise prohibits others from safely enjoying our recreational / urban facilities. The policy also includes those with parental responsibilities for the behaviour of their child / children under legal age.

Reporting

West Bedlington Town Council Assets.

On each and every occasion The Town Council is notified of vandalism to its assets (bus shelters, litter bins and public seats etc. the reported vandalism will be immediately reported to Nortumbria Police via their online incident reporting system.

Importantly there should be some evidence or knowledge that any damage has been as a result of vandalism and not simply wear and tear of the asset. In addition to notifying Northumbria Police we will assess the damage and determine how best to make it good. Our preferred method of reporting these issues is via email to

Please provide as much detail as possible about the vandalism to help with the Polices investigation.

Police Incident Reporting System.

Not every accident or incident is serious enough to call the Police but it may have an overall impact on the safety of our town.

There are many incidents that happen every day around Bedlington that go unreported. If they were, they may add up to a possible long term issue that needs to be addressed.

Northumbria Police have set up this online incident log to record evidence that could be used to submit a request to the relevant authority to get something done. Because without any evidence nothing will be!
